His focus has been in the areas of education, health, human rights, women empowerment, environment, culture, and heritage. has had the honor of launching the biggest education reform program of Punjab, in 2002, which was then adopted throughout Pakistan. The World Bank supported this program as its partner. This reform program was rated as one of the best programs aimed at achieving the Millennium Development Goals.

Mian Imran Masood also made a policy for quality enhancement and research in educational Institutions. Higher Education Commission was promoted and strengthened during his tenure, to monitor the universities of Pakistan. Many private universities were established during his stint.

He has represented various organisations in different capacities He has travelled extensively all over the world, to attend conferences and seminars.

Pakistan.Prof. Jaspal, as a Guest Speaker/Visiting Lecturer, had delivered and still continues to deliver lectures at many professional and training institutions including distinguished NATO School, Oberammergau, Germany; NATO Defense College Rome, Italy, Center of Excellence: Defence against Terrorism, Ankara, Turkey; National Security & War Courses of Pakistan's National Defence University; Intelligence Bureau Academy, Command and Staff College Quetta; Air War College, Karachi, Pakistan Navy War College, Lahore and Foreign Service Academy of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Pakistan. Prof. Jaspal holds PhD and M.Phil. in International Relations and M.A. in Political Science. He is an alumnus of the European Peace University Stadtschlaining, Austria; Oslo University, Norway, and Sandia National Laboratories, Albuquerque, New Mexico, United States.

Prof. Jaspal research interests include Pakistan's national security, Proliferation of nuclear weapons and missiles systems, particularly in South Asia and Middle East; arms control/disarmament and nuclear nonproliferation regime; Trends in the global and domestic politics of Pakistan; Terrorism, particularly CBRN Terrorism, and bio-security.

Dr. Syed Hussain is a Professor, Chairman of the Department of International Relations, and former Director of the Institute of Peace and Conflict Studies with the University of Peshawar, following a career as researcher and teacher of International Relations, Conflict Resolution, Political Science and Creative Leadership. He completed his M. Phil and PhD from the University of Edinburgh, Scotland. He remained fellow of Fulbright, Carnegie, Charles Wallace, Higher Education Commission (HEC), and Edinburgh University. He taught at the Fulbright Commission, Bulgaria for five years (2010-2014), where his teaching and training concerned peace & conflict resolution during the 21st century, especially extremism in

the conflict zones like FATA (Pakistan), Afghanistan, and the Middle East. Dr. Syed Hussain has written more than fifty-two (52) research papers on India, Pakistan, tribal areas of Pakistan, War on Terror, Afghanistan, Pak-US relations, Conflict Resolution, and the application of strategies to the prevention of terrorism, extremism and amelioration of counter-violent extremism. He edited a volume titled "Socio-Economic and Political Currents in FATA: A Way Forward" in 2015. His forthcoming books are on "Pak-US relations: A Comparative Study during Cold War and War on Terror". His latest book published is "Religion, Economics and Politics of FATA" (an edited volume, released from Peter Lang Publishers, US, on 5th October, 2021).

He has consulted for numerous foundations and government agencies on subjects like governance, local government, police reforms, education policy, federalism and decentralization. He is a visiting professor at the Command and Staff College, Quetta, National Institute of Management (NIM) Peshawar and National School of Public Policy (NSPP), Lahore. He is also member of the editorial board of 'the Exemplar', a journal of South Asian Studies in California, United States, Journal of South Asian Studies, Journal of Political Studies, Journal of Indian Studies, Journal of NUST University, CIPS and Margalla Papers at the NDU, Islamabad. Dr Soherwordi regularly contributes his write-ups in "The News" and "Daily Times" newspapers.

Ejaz Haider


